The end of Professor Isidore Okpewho's pilgrimage on earth resonates with the full significance of the thoughtful assertion by Ojaide. In fact, a meteor has vanished from the literary firmament. Okpewho dazzlingly shone through the universe with his attributes of endearing personality, precocious literary scholarship and inspiring creativity in fiction.

My numerous interactions with him in the United States of America and Nigeria,

Witty, affable, patient, persevering and level-headed, Okpewho radiated a personality embodying a humanism that was necessary for combating distanteful racial, ethnic and religious bigotry that is virtually wrecking the foundation of harmonious and peacuful co-existence among the various peoples of the globe. His oracular authority in the scholarship of

But his celebrated novels and mentorship in creative writing have successfully elevated this literary giant to the status of an author-critic which is a rare combination

A letter conveying the appointment which was made available to UniFort Wackly, described the programme as an action-research actwork which aims to canacitiate the evidence for change, while maing on building a new economy and promotis armative development policies for the continent. Professor Arekeyu, who is also Associate Dean of the School of Graduate Studies (SGS), stated that through the programme, he "would be part of a One Year Dinlogue Process with about 25 other leaders Year Dislogue Process with about 25 other leaders and change agents from Kezva, Nigeria, Senegal, Uganda, Ethiopia, South Africa and Zinzbabwe," amongst other participants, adding that the core interventions of the process will take place between November, 2016 and December, 2017, during which the Lab is expected to stimulate critical thinking and innovative practices for the achievement

According to him, the organizations essavening the programme are WX-Africa Network, the Global Leadership Academy and African Centre for Green
