
Udeala Now Fellow, Academy of Pharmacy



Nwankwo Tackles Terrorism In Nigeria

Donna-Carine Nwankwo, Master of Science student in the Department of Political and Administrative Studies, Faculty of Social Sciences, is finding solution to the menace of terrorism in Nigeria. Our Correspondent, HUMPHREY OGU reports

ognisant of the importance of education, Donna-Carine Nwankwo, began journey into the academic world with a Bachelor of Education degree in Adult and Non-Formal Education (English option) in the University of Port Harcourt, where she later obtained a Postgraduate Diploma in International Affairs programme in the Department of Political and Administrative Studies.

Determined to contribute to attainment of peace and development in the country, Nwankwo returned to her alma mater, where she is currently concluding an MSc

"terrorism, which is a major challenge to development, could have historical, cultural, political, social, psychological, economic, or religious background or any combination of the above-mentioned causes," stressing the need to prioritise education in the country as a way of check the menace, which, she said, often stem from ignorance and illiteracy.

"Terrorism has emerged as a global threat that attacks national and international security and territorial integrity which retards the development and economic growth of nations" she said citing the dreaded Islamic sect, Boko Haram: Jamáá Ahl al-Sunnah Lidda 'awati

Jama'atu Ansaril Muslimina Fi
Biladis Sudan, which means
Vanguards for the protection of
Muslims in Black Africa as
terrorist groups that have wreaked
havoc on the Nigerian nation,
leaving in its trail heavy
developmental setback.

Calling on government to focus on dialogue, speedy trial of suspects, tackling unemployment and corruption, building a

strong educational structure, Nwankwo stressed the need for the citizenry to embrace peace, tolerance and patriotism. "Nigerians should bear in mind that effecting positive changes in the country requires the input of citizens. Individuals need to change

tribalism, social vices and strive to contribute towards peace and development of the country, rather wait for government to do everything for them," she added.

Nwankwo, who noted that every segment of society has a role to play in checking terrorism, said: "Parents should inculcate in their children the norms and values of the society. Government at all levels should tackle the insecurity challenges in the country, rather than focussing on the 2015 elections. Religious leaders should guide their followers rightly to curb fanaticism, which culminates in religious crises," urging Nigerians to learn lessons from Afghanistan and other countries that have been devastated by terrorism.

"Terrorism against religious groups and politically-motivated expressions of violence in the present democratic era has threatened development, democratic governance, economic activities, education, the political image of Nigeria in Africa and globally. The achievements of growth and development have been challenged as a result of insecurity," she observed, citing the numerous bombing of churches, Police station and United Nations Building in Abuja, all of which resulted in colossal loss of lives and invaluable property.

She expressed fear that until the terrorist related challenges posed by Boko Haram and Ansaru are tackled, the attainment of the much-talked about Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) by 2015 and Vision 20:2020 will elude the country.





Ugiomoh To Serve As Curator At Abuja Arts Festival

ne of the foremost Arts Historians in the country and Lecturer in the Department of Fine Arts and Design, Professor Frank Ugiomoh, is among three scholars to feature as Curators for the forthcoming resurrected Abuja Biennale. Others are Professor Tonie Okpe of Ahmadu Bello University (ABU), Zaria and an independent Curator, Bisi Silva from Lagos State.

Making the disclosure to UNIPORT Weekly penultimate Tuesday, Professor Ugiomoh, who traced the origin of arts festival to Latin America where artists showcase their works for appreciation and evaluation, stated that By Otikor Samuel

the first t s held in Brazil, biennale was adding that the Venice Biennale has been very popular since its establishment on 19th April, 1893.

"In Africa, the Dakar Arts Biennale has been very consistent and the eleventh edition will hold next year," Professor Ugiomoh said, recalling that, "about four years ago, Nigeria tried to start a similar event with the introduction of African Regional Summit & Exhibition for Visual Arts (ARESUVA). It held twice under the National Gallery of Arts (NGA) before going into extinction. It is the same NGA that is resuscitating ARESUVA under a new name, Abuja Biennale."

The Arts Historian, who expressed delight over the resuscitation of the arts festival in Nigeria, said the Abuja Biennale will increase participation of Africans, particularly Nigerian artists, who were denied exposure at international festivals, praising the National Gallery of Arts for recommending his nomination.

On how to handle the responsibility at the forthcoming festival, Professor Ugiomoh said: "I have featured in several international, continental and national exhibitions as a Curator; one of which was on Nigerian Platform at Dakar Biennale and Nigerian Arts for Nigerian Embassy in Israel in 2006," expressing optimism that he would carry out his responsibilities smoothly.

"Application Letter, Academic Transcript, Reference Letters from two Academic Referees, Current Curriculum Vitae (CV) and Letter of Motivation for joining the programme applied for should be submitted to the Dean of the Faculty, on or before 24th August, 2013", the letter stated. Professor Akonye also added that the date was extended from the initial date of 17th August, 2013 to allow for wide participation.

n the last eight weeks, academic activities in Nigerian public universities have been brought to a halt as a result of withdrawal of teaching service by academic staff. The leadership of Academic Staff Union of Universities (ASUU) has accused the Federal Government of insincerity in the implementation of the 2009 Agreement signed with it. The ugly development has raised serious concern from stakeholders in the system - students, parents/guardians, as well as staff. Already, the society has

They regret that graduates are not properly equipped for the labour market, as they have to be made to undergo additional training to be ready for the industry. Indeed, it is most disturbing that under this scenario, no Nigerian university is ranked among the top 5000 universities in the world. This situation is appalling and poses great dangers for the country. It is even more worrisome as the country desires to be among the 20 most industrialized counties of the world by the year 2020.

Due to the unemployability of graduates of the Nigerian educational system most parents, who are financially

endowed, prefer to send their children to universities outside Nigeria. Indeed, countries such as Ghana and South Africa have also be comedestination choices of

Nigerians desirous to acquire quality education.

ASUU in its defence says that its action is aimed at

saving the Nigerian educational system, stating that poor infrastructural development in the country's universities provides an atmosphere that is not conducive for learning. Issues such as inadequate power supply, ill-equipped laboratories, out-dated library stocks, lack of classroom and office spaces, are major features of the Nigerian university system. No doubt, it is impossible for any system bedevilled by these conditions to compete with their better equipped counterparts elsewhere.

It is also important to note that private universities are fast rising in profile and

competing favourably with pubic universities. As time goes on, we would get to a situation where public universities would decline to the state of public primary and secondary schools.

The reality is that no parent who desires the best would be prepared to mortgage the future of his or her child.

It is high time stakeholders

in the university system acted fast to s a l v a g e t h e situation. In this regard, the Federal Government and ASUU should come to terms in order to s a v e Nigerian universities from total collapse so that the future of the society can be guaranteed.
