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Egbogah Concludes Expert-In-Residence Programme in UNIPORT

onths after he promised to kick-start his much-awaited Expert-in-Residence programme, foremost Petroleum Engineer and Educationist and Elder Statesman, Dr Emmanuel Egbogah, finally flagged off the event in the University, with a promise to make it an annual feature aimed at mentoring the younger generation of Nigerians in the art of building their careers.

The week-long programme which also featured the 2st Chi Ikoku Chair Lecture in Petroleum Engineering, had the Distinguished Scholar and pioneer Petroleum Engineer interact with scholars and students drawn from the Institute of Petroleum Studies, Centre for Petroleum Geosciences, as well as Emerald Energy Institute for Petroleum Economics, Policy and Strategic Studies, amongst others.

Speaking at the opening ceremony last Monday at the Institute of Petroleum Studies (IPS) Park, Dr Egbogah said that the concept of Expert-in-Residence is the norm in established universities, starting with Oxford and Cambridge as far back as 1269, adding that it was important that great centres of learning such as the University of Port Harcourt cultivate the habit of attracting such Experts, who would visit regularly to interact with scholars and students with a view to helping them tackle the challenges they may face in the course of building their careers.

The former Special Adviser to the President on Petroleum Matters said that an Expert-in-Residence is usually an experienced master of the discipline, who is ready to make available his or her vast pool of experience to younger professionals and students to enable them improve on their career prospects and prepare to face other challenges of life. He said that such strategy was usually of immense benefit to individual scholars, students and benefitting institutions.

Citing the likes of Isaac Newton, who though a Professor of Physics, impacted immensely on the younger generation of scholars and students as an Expert-in-Residence in his days, Egbogah, who is Chairman of Emerald Energy Resources Limited, stated that "due to the positive effects of such a programme, there is no student in Cambridge or Oxford universities, who fail their degree examinations.

This is because the enormous benefits derived from the experiences of the Experts, ensure that students excel in academics and other endeavours". Dr Egbogah said that as the first Entrepreneurial University in Nigeria, the University of Port Harcourt deserves a programme, where individuals are helped to gain entrepreneurial experience that would be of immense benefit to them in the wider society.

"This is a University that should equip such individuals with the creativity and innovation that they can take to the wider spectrum.

The University should have special focus as a conveyor of entrepreneurship to the larger society. Most of these activities are not captured through normal classroom lectures, but through interactions with Experts with immense experience", he stated, hoping that the programmes would expand to enable stakeholders "make it a beehive of interaction, innovation and creativity which would transform the University into a truly Entrepreneurial University for Nigeria and the

rest of Africa".

Declaring the programme open, Vice-Chancellor, Professor Joseph Ajienka, who was represented by Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic), Professor Igho Joe, said that the idea of the programme was to look at issues involved in the oil and gas sector, noting that the lifewire of the country rested on the critical oil and gas sector. He said his administration would encourage any initiative that would improve the sector.

In their separate speeches, Professors Bosa Okoli,

Onyewuchi Akaranta, Adewale Dosunmu, Dulu Appah, Joel Ogbonna, Ayoade Kuye, Dr Sunday Ikiensimama and Representative of IFP School in IPS, Mr Francis Fusier, hailed the exemplary initiative of Egbogah in helping students and younger professionals to face the challenges they may face in their career choices, adding that the scheme was a good example that should be encouraged so that the society can grow. Earlier in a welcome address, Director, Institute of Petroleum Studies (IPS), Professor Mike Onyekonwu, who described Dr Egbogah as a major benefactor of the University, said that the event was the beginning of many good things to come in the oil and gas industry.

At a consultative Forum with students, Dr Egbogah advised them to imbibe entrepreneurial skills through creativity and innovation in order to meet the current realities. According to Dr Egbogah, going by its avowed Entrepreneurial vision, the University of Port Harcourt should be a leading University in the country, describing it as a place where students are nurtured and prepared for the future.

Speaking with UNIPORT Weekly after the interactive session, Director of the Centre for Occupational Health, Safety and Environment (COHSE), Professor Ify Nwaogazie, said that the essence of the programme is to strengthen the entrepreneurship vision of the University and institutionalize a mentoring scheme that would enable students achieve the best in and outside the classroom. The programme ended last Thursday with a Round-Table on Nigerian Content Development initiative, chaired by Emeritus Professor Nimi Briogs.

undertook on behalf of Chevron Nigeria Limited, the multinational oil giant has again selected the Department for the second phase of the project.

A Letter signed by Manager, ESRS of the company, M. Duke and made available to UNIPORT Weekly partly read: "We are pleased to inform you that your Department has been selected for 2012 Joint t h e Industry/University Special Study Spatial/Temporal Porosity Variation in OMLs 86 & 88, using data from Funiwa Deep 1A, Akuku-1, Pennington-29, &Oriri-1wells.

"Your selection is based on the successful and satisfactory delivery of Phase 1 of this study

for our Western Asset Area (OML90) and your demonstrated technical capability and your proposal of October 17, 2012," the letter pointed out. Explaining the importance of the study to our Correspondent in the office of Acting Head of Department, last Monday, Professors Michael Oti and Levi Amajor, who led the study team, said that the hydrocarbons reside in the pores of the rocks pointing out that a good rock must have porosity.

The company, however, found out that some of the rocks did not have such properties; a situation they noted prompted the invitation of the Department to participate in the first phase, attributing the extension of the study to the success recorded in the previous exercise.

The Dons said the success recorded in the study has shown that scholars have the expertise to solve most technical problems bedeviling the industry, disclosing that the study package is

valued at \$200,000 US dollars. Director, Institute of Natural Resources and Environmental

Sustainability (INRES), Professor Enuvie Akpokodje was also part of the team.

Also speaking, Acting Head of Department, Dr Akaha Tse, recalled that "Chevron sent letters to all Geology Departments in Nigerian universities and based on our proposals, we were selected out of 13 institutions that responded to the invitation," adding that the study which aimed at tackling production challenges of the company in one of its fields was valued at \$96,000.

Chancellor, Professor Joseph Ajienka, has congratulated the Department on its success in the first phase of the study which earned the trust of the oil giant, resulting in the extension of the study. Professor Ajienka described the breakthrough as a clear example of industry-academia synergy, which he said was in line with the entrepreneurial vision of his administration to build a world-class university.



Professor Ajienka also informed members of a proposal to implement the Student Computer Ownership Scheme (SCOS), adding that Deans and Heads of Department should encourage their students to apply online to own their computers through a number of firms approved by the Federal Government for the purpose.

Senate also approved Second Semester and Degree results as presented by various Faculties following their ratification by both the Degree Results Verification and Senate Business Committees. Results approved were from the Faculties of Humanities, Social Sciences, Engineering,

Management Sciences, Agriculture, School of Science Laboratory Technology (SSLT), College of Natural and Applied Sciences, College of Health Sciences, as well as College of Graduate Studies. Senate also approved appointment of External

Examiners for the Departments of Educational Foundations, Adult and Non-Formal Education, Agricultural Economics and Extension, as well as Crop and Soil Science. It also approved the reappointment of External Examiners for the Department of Mechanical Engineering. The august body also considered and approved the 13th Report of the Senate Appeals Committee on Certificate Verification presented by its Chairman, Professor Eugene Onyeike.

Professor Ajjenka introduced the pioneer Provost of the College of Graduate Studies, Professor Roseline Konya, who later introduced the pioneer Deans of the new Faculties under the College.
