Port Harcourt.



UniPort Student Leader Emerges NANS Senate President

ewly-elected President of the Senate of the National Association of Nigerian Students (NANS), Mr. Maxwell Nyanabo, has paid a courtesy visit on the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Joseph Ajienka, with a request for assistance from the Administration to set up a functional Secretariat in the University.

Briefing the Vice-Chancellor on the election that brought him to the exalted office, penultimate week, the new NANS Senate President disclosed that an emergency meeting of the body in UniPort, impeached his predecessor based on a grave allegation against which he was apparently unable to defend himself before a duly constituted Disciplinary Committee set up for the purpose.

Chancellor that he emerged Senate President following a competitive electoral process involving aspirants from other universities, requested the authorities to organize a reception to mark his historic victory at the poll and also serve as a mark of recognition of his new position in national Student Union politics.

Receiving the new Senate President, Professor Ajienka congratulated him for achieving the landmark feat, promising that the Administration would continue to work in concert with well-intentioned student leaders to promote robust unionism that is directed to positive

"In this University, we insist on dealing with our students through the Dean of the Student Affairs Department. I, therefore, advise that NANS should always deal with the duly accredited Student Union of each university to ensure that there is no confusion in the order of reporting and responding to your legitimate concerns as a body. visit by other officers of NANS.

Expressing displeasure over the existence of what he described as "several NANS with conflicting motives and pecuniary interests," Professor Ajienka advised Nigerian students to refrain from engaging in partisan politics as a way of maintaining their neutrality and credibility as a body.

"Let me also advise students to address politicians with utmost decorum and respect that they deserve as elected and appointed national leaders. You must be very careful in your utterances because students are not politicians. See the positions you are currently privileged to occupy in the Union as a learning ground for future leadership roles to your fatherland. The President of the Federal Republic, Dr Goodluck Jonathan, Governors, Legislator, Religious Leaders and Captains of Industry-all played significant leadership roles in the Students Union at some point in this University-and have brought immense pride to their Alma Mater and country in their current positions", he reminded them.

Urging Nigerian Students to resist the temptation of being used by unpatriotic elements to foment trouble in the country, which he said was passing through a very difficult phase of national development, the Vice-Chancellor appealed to students to show maturity at all times as they seek relevance through unionism, without contributing to heating up the polity.

Professor Ajienka, who was represented by the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Administration), Professor Ethelbert Nduka made the commendation when he received a delegation led by Professor Odidika Umeozor on a courtesy visit to the University last Friday to express gratitude to the authorities for facilitating aspects of the Yenagoa gathering.

impact of Autism on our society", the Vice-Chancellor noted.

Speaking earlier, Leader of the delegation, Professor Umeozor thanked Management of the University for supporting the conference, which he described as hugely successful. "We came to thank Management for approving funds for the conference. We thank the University for providing our delegates with accommodation and security escorts to facilitate our movement".

Professor Umeozor disclosed that the Entomological Society of Nigeria holds its conference annually in October. "The Theme for this year's conference was Insect Taxonomy: Curatorial Challenges to Entomological Practices in Nigeria", the conference covered areas of interest, which are about insects and their effects on humans and the environment; the importance of insects in the ecosystem services which include pollination of

Finomo's Presentation On N'Delta Gets Rave Reviews in America

Lecture delivered by Dr Julia Finomo, a specialist in Environmental Ethics at three different institutions in the United States of America, has continued to receive encomiums from participants. Dr Finomo, who lectures at the Department of Religious and Cultural Studies, Faculty of Humanities, presented



America, last month.

In the Lecture titled: "Cost-Benefit Analysis of Oil Drilling in the Niger Delta: An Ethical Perspective," Finomo acknowledged that though oil exploration in the region was raking in huge foreign exchange to country and impacting positively on some inhabitants of the areas, she regretted that the multinational companies were not conforming to international best practices with regards to devastating impact of their activities on communities in which they operate.

She also censured the Federal Government on what she described as playing the Ostrich with stringent environmental laws and policies that are never implemented by relevant government agencies, resulting not only in incalculable environmental devastation, but also short-changing inhabitants of the Niger Delta region where crude oil is explored and exploited to develop other parts of the country.

Her approach towards charting a way forward for the mainstay of Nigeria's economy, was described as unprejudiced and all-embracing, thereby, attracting commendation from the participants, particularly the Rev. Michael McFarland Center for Religion and Culture, Holy Cross College, Worcester, Massachusetts, that facilitated the trip.

"It was a special opportunity for our Faculty, students and staff to hear your first-hand account of the environmental degradation in the Niger Delta region of Nigeria. Many in the audience were unaware of the situation in the Niger Delta and found your presentation enlightening and your passion inspirational. Your focus on the ethical analyses of oil drilling practices in the Niger Delta was a nice match for our mission as a Centre for Religion, Ethics and Culture," acknowledged the Centre Director, Thomas Landy.

"A rare display of razor-sharp intellect in applying the subject of ethics in dissecting the eco-cost analysis of oil spillage in the Niger Delta region of Nigeria, Finomo, you are a proven and emerging environmental ethics expert that every lover of environmental sustainability must watch out for. Finomo, at this level of scholarship, we speak of what we see and not what we heard. My appraisal is based on your presentation that I have watched. Please, accept it. You have worked hard for it," wrote Olugu Ukpai in a letter obtained by UniPort Weekly.

Professor Victor Archibong of the Department of Political Science and Legal Administration at Greensboro College also praised Dr Finomo, saying: "Your presentation was thought-provoking and shows your knowledge and passion for the subject-matter. My students couldn't believe that such an environmental degradation is going on in Nigeria, but because you made a compelling case as to why the situation had to change, many of them are now opting to write their term papers on that topic. They want to research the topic further. Again, thank you for sharing your knowledge with us."

Relieving her experience, Dr Finomo, expressed satisfaction with the positive reaction that greeted her presentation. "I felt very excited and fulfilled at the reactions from participants during and after the presentations. The joy of every Lecturer is the positive response he/she gets from the audience and the impact of his/her contribution to the body of knowledge and I was thrilled by the positive reactions I got," she said.

The Management of PTDF disclosed that the Fund is also inviting applications from suitably qualified candidates for the Master of Science (MSc) and Doctoral scholarships. A combined aptitude test will be conducted for both the 2013/2014 and 2014/2015 MSc



ust months after Dr Eucharia Nwaichi of the Department of Biochemistry in the Faculty of Chemical Sciences, College of Natural and Applied Sciences received the prestigious L'Oreal Award for innovation in scientific research in Paris, France, another Lecturer in the Department of Human Physiology, Faculty of Basic Medical Sciences, College of Health Sciences, Dr. Fortune Amah-Tariah, has been conferred with the Fellowship of the same Paris-based organization for Women in Science, this time in Johannesburg, South Africa.

The award was conferred on Dr. Amah-Tariah towards the completion of her Doctoral Degree in the same Department in UniPort. The Candidate will be jointly supervised by Professors Datonye Dapper and Antonia Okerengwo, both of the Faculty of Basic Medical Sciences.

Exchanging views with Correspondent of UniPort Weekly, a visibly-delighted Head of Department, Professor Arthur Nwafor, said that Dr. Amah-Tariah's research centred on "deepening human understanding of the involvement of environmentally-associated pollution in the Niger Delta region on immunological factors in preeclampsia and other pregnancy-related complications such as diabetes, hypertension and the Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV), amongst women in Port Harcourt, Nigeria.'

he School of Basic Studies has commenced sale of application forms for the 2013/2014 Pre-Degree programme in the Colleges of Engineering, Health Sciences, Natural and Applied Sciences; Faculties of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Social Sciences (Geography and Environmental Studies), and Certificate Programmes in the Faculties of Humanities and Education.

A Memo signed by the Registrar, Mrs Matilda Nnodim, and obtained by UniPort Weekly, last week, stated that the programme which is open to applicants with a minimum of five credits in the Senior School Certificate Examination (SSCE), General Certificate Examination (GCE) conducted by the West African Examination Council (WAEC) and National Examination Council (NECO), respectively and other relevant certificates,

should be accessed online from 30th September to Friday, 15th November, 2013, when the portal would be short

Prospective candidates were further informed that admission into the various programme options would be contingent on candidates passing the Computer-Based Test (CBT) scheduled to commence between Monday, 25th to Friday, 29th November, 2013 at the Information and Communication Technology Centre (ICTC) Building, University Park.

"All candidates wishing to transit to the Degree programme, must in addition to the obtaining the required five credits in the desired field of study, pass the prescribed pre-Degree examinations; have the appropriate Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) subject combination and must have the national minimum score in the 2014/2015 UTME," the Registrar

UniPort Robust Literary Culture

As the 6th Port Harcourt Book Festival (formerly Garden City Literary Festival) kicks off today, HUMPHREY OGU of our Literary Desk looks at the place of UniPort in the Nigerian Literary landscape.

Por several decades now, University of Port Harcourt has indubitably remained a major stakeholder in literature and the arts generally. The University has, at different times, been home to some of the best known of critics of African literature. Professors Ola Rotimi, Gerald Moore, Ulli Beier Winifred Feuser, Kay Williamson, Charles Nnolim, Chidi Maduka, Helen Chukwuma, Chidi Ikonne, Sunday Anozie, Chidi Amuta and lately Omolara Ogundipe are some of the notable names associated with the University.

Others included the oldest living African Writer, Dr Gabriel Okara, foremost novelist and playwright, Elechi Amadi and leading short story writer and novelist, Ifeanyi Aniebo, three of who are currently Writers-in-Residence in the University. These men of letters have made huge contributions to the development of African literature. The University has also produced younger creative writers such as Ebinyo Ogbowei, Nengi Ilagha, Obari Gomba, Ifeanyi Ajaegbo, Uche Peter Umez, Barine Ngaage, Sophia Obi-Apoko, Margaret Nutsukpo and Juliet Francis. Some of the names listed here have either won important international literary prizes or made the shortlist of the prestigious Nigerian Liquefied Natural Gas Prize for Literature, which is the richest literary prize on the continent of Africa at various times.

For instance, Ogbowei, who took an MPhil in African Literature from UniPort, was on the shortlist in 2005, 2009 and 2013, while Ilagha, who obtained a BA in English Studies, also made it in 2009. Again, Gomba, who received his higher degrees from UniPort, where he currently teaches in the Department of English Studies, also made the list this year. Current postgraduate students in the Department and multiple

award-wining writers, Umez and Ajaegbo, have also been nominated for the coveted prize, with the former in 2006 and 2011 and the later in 2012.

In dramatic literature, UniPort has remained a leading institution for training dramatists, actors, actresses and indeed in arts and entertainment. Director, Institute of Arts and Culture, Professor Julie Okoh, has not only continued to churn out stage and screenplays, but also younger playwrights and performing artists, including ace comedian, Julius Agwu, who has recently taken to musi-comedy and writing, not forgetting Michael Ogbolosingha and Michael Ogolo.

This robust literary culture has been sustained by a literature-loving Vice-Chancellor, who has never ceased to receive accolades from authors, literary critics, actors and film producers. Or what can one say of a professional Petroleum Engineer, who established an Institute of Arts and Culture, appointed Writersin-Residences and University Poet and Curator? As Director, Institute of Petroleum Studies, Professor Ajienka co-sponsored the celebration of Elechi Amadi in 2008.

That same year, the ship of what is now known as the Port Harcourt Book Festival berthed in UniPort, with such literary icons as the Nobel Laureate, Professor

Wole Soyinka, Elechi Amadi, Gabriel Okara, Kofi Awoonor, Okey Ndibe, and the literature-loving governor of Rivers State, Chibuike Amaechi, amongst other literary enthusiasts aboard.

On a sombre note, "Death has made war upon our house". It is quite regrettable to ask: "What is the wailing for? Somebody is dead. It is Awoonor himself. (Songs of Sorrow)

Since 2008, many literary icons have visited UniPort. On the list are Professors Olu Obafemi, Femi Osofisan, and Akachi Ezigbo, Karen King-Aribisala. The list also includes younger writers such as Helon Habila, and Adaobi Nwaubani, Chimeka Garricks, Igoni Barrett, Kaine Agary, amongst others. It has been six years of robust literature in UniPort.

Welcome to UniPort, co-host of the Port Harcourt Book Festival. Port Harcourt may be the World Book Capital; but UniPort remains the epicentre of the city and by extension the capital of the World Book Capital. That's my view, Welcome folks!
